Rapport

Rapport is when a teacher builds and creates a relationship with a student. Rapport is very important in any classroom because when students feel connected to their teacher in a positive way then they will enjoy class more. I will build connectedness by doing the following:

- Display students work when they receive a good grade
- Showing students I care about them
- Monthly meeting that involve the parents/guardians in their child's education
- Create a safe environment in classrooms where our students can share their thoughts
- Encourage students to attend school activities, and community service opportunities

Classroom Management

Classroom management is something that all teachers must consider. Every teacher will have different techniques to manage their classroom. The following bullet points will be some of the classroom management techniques that I will implement in my classroom:

• Use positive reinforcements when students follow your directions.

- Create a list of expectations with the students in my class and make a copy for every student.

- Use an exit ticket at the end of class to see what the students have learned from the lesson.
